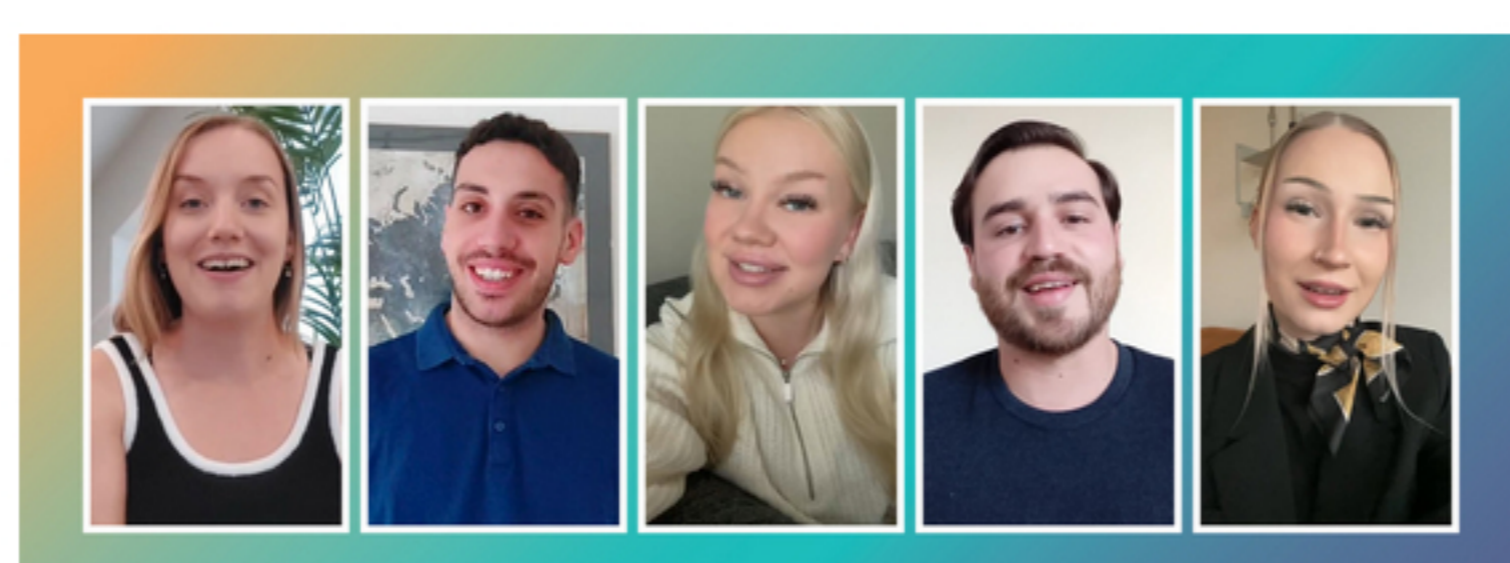

Successful Launch of the TEAMIT+ training program across 4 countries!

TEAMIT+ kicked off its training program with an impactful Climate and Solidarity Day on October 10. Held simultaneously in Bordeaux (FR), Pamplona (ES), Jyväskylä (FI), and Kozani (GR), the event brought together over 200 young people to tackle climate challenges.
